- small adhesive tape

- pencils/sharpeners

TOYS

- foam/tennis ball
- hacky sack
- plastic dinosaurs, animals, toy figures (no war figurines)

PERSONAL CARE ITEMS

ADDITIONAL TIPS THAT MAY HELP:

- Pack bar soap in a plastic travel soap container and then place in a plastic bag or wrap with plastic wrap.
- Remove packaging from your items to allow for more room in the shoebox and they don't have as much trash to throw away.
- Don't send anything that has directions/writing in English
 (i.e. toys with instructions, games that require kids to read
 English.) Since these boxes go to non-English speaking
 countries, it's worth only including things that are
 understood internationally.



DO NOT INCLUDE: Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
