

ALLIANCE ESL COMES TO JAPAN

When you mix dedicated, passionate ESL trainers who love what they do with willing participants, you see God work. According to the Joshua Project, the Japanese are the world's second-largest unreached people group. During our home assignment in 2021, we met with Bruce Lyman, director for Alliance ESL at the Alliance National Office, to hear his passion for this ministry and learn about the potential to use it in reaching Japanese people for Jesus. Our last meeting was days before we returned to Japan for our last term as Alliance international workers (IWs) prior to our approaching retirement. Bruce has a clear calling to reach out to people from around the world whom God is bringing to the United States and who need to hear about Jesus. We learned from him that God had brought many Japanese people to the Akron, Ohio, area, where Bruce lives, and that a large group of Japanese attended ESL classes at his church. Bruce stayed in touch with many of them even after they returned to Japan.

During the 2023 Japan Alliance Mission Strategic Review, it became apparent that several of our IWs were using English

teaching as a tool in their ministries. Why not train them and others to do so more effectively and have a greater impact in sharing the gospel? This became one of the action steps following the review.

This past February, a team of four representing Alliance ESL traveled to Japan to present three English as a second language training workshops for Alliance IWs and Christian workers from other groups. Over 60 workers from 20 organizations participated, with 32 churches represented. Some of the trainees shared, "We learned the importance of building relationships with our students and to be intentional about sharing the gospel with them." The Japan Alliance Mission's newest church plant, Fujimi Christ Church in the Tokyo area, led by Don and Rachel Schaeffer, is launching this month. All five of their teammates took the Alliance ESL training and are planning to begin an ESL ministry within the first month of opening. Many would like to see more workshops in the future! Pray for this to become a reality.

UPDATE FROM UKRAINE

We, and the Ukrainian people we serve, cannot express our thankfulness enough to those who have been praying for us in this crucial time. On March 11, Ukraine accepted a 30-day ceasefire—please pray for a permanent end to the conflict. We praise God for the opportunity to continue serving Him amid this crisis and for His protection of church pastors and other gospel ministers. A house near our home was destroyed by a rocket, but God kept us safe.

Ministries here continue at full speed. Each church has new seekers coming to events. The oldest congregation in our association had its 30th anniversary! This church provides a strong base for ministry and for planting new churches. Six churches and 12 preaching points have started through this congregation. Aid of many types has continued to be funneled to churches near the front lines. A youth/young adult evening for six churches, held in March, was a real encouragement enjoyed by all.

Continue to pray for a fair and lasting peace that allows Ukraine to rebuild and have a future. Pray, too, for upcoming Easter services, as this time of year is a great opportunity to share the good news of Christ.
