JOINING IN SOUL CARE

We saw God work in so many ways in two soul care seminars we recently taught and came away encouraged. We taught the same material we usually teach but from a slightly different angle: the kingdom of darkness vs. the Kingdom of light (God). As we looked at each principle, we talked about what our culture deems acceptable and what living in the light looks like. We charted on the board, which made it very visible and concrete for each person.

For example, in African culture in general, a "bigger" person would never ask forgiveness from a "lesser" person. So, a boss would never ask for forgiveness from an employee, a pastor would never ask forgiveness of a church member, and a husband would never ask forgiveness of a wife. These are culturally accepted and practiced norms that are in direct opposition to what Jesus teaches. You can imagine the destruction this is causing in churches and marriages.

All the pastors/wives in the second week came from the area of the country where terrorism and persecution are a constant threat. Please pray for them—that God would meet their needs, encourage them, and enable them to walk as lights in the darkness.

One pastor was actually kidnapped. His wife said, "If he is killed, then I guess

our ministry here is finished. If he returns alive, then God still has work for us here." He was miraculously returned, and the couple chose to stay in that village. The pastor forgave both the person who betrayed him and his captors.

We were incredibly moved when the oldest pastor in the room shared a testimony about how he had gotten so tired of push back and criticism that he had caved and was living in the darkness. He broke down in tears (very unusual culturally) and asked for prayer that he would have the courage to live in the light as he returned to his church/village.

Both the national church president and the district president attended, and the district president taught several sessions. He did an amazing job, and we are encouraged that he will continue to teach and use this material. Naomi, the lady who did so much of the groundwork for the conference, also led quite a bit of the application and spent hours praying with and counseling pastors each evening. We know that she will continue to walk with them as well.

Quite a few couples came for prayer, and many are struggling in their marriages. Would you pray specifically that God will bring healing to their marriages?

IN THE MIDST OF UNREST

Last month marked two years in the Middle East. This is the longest amount of time I have spent abroad. Back in 2020, my time overseas was cut short by the pandemic. For a moment this summer, things felt eerily similar as I chronicled several weeks spent outside the country and my journey back, while the 12-day war was waged in the skies across the Middle East. Two months after my return, our city remains stable, and I am immensely grateful for your prayers during this time and for the Lord's continued provision allowing myself and my team to continue serving and searching for His people here.

In a world full of turmoil, it is reassuring to know that nothing happens beyond the knowledge and wisdom of God. During the war, thankfully beyond closed airports and cancelled flights, the city I live in was almost untouched. Nevertheless, the situation for the countries neighboring us remains precarious.

As the whole team is entering a period of unanticipated waiting, please pray that the Lord would give us wisdom about how to spend our time and patience to do what is His will and not ours. Please pray for young men and women who are seeking to follow the Lord in the midst of unbelieving families and for our country to be stable in the middle of unrest.

AS HIS POWER RESTS ON US

The end of August marked the 20-year anniversary since I moved overseas as an international worker. 20 years in, I'm again in that learning phase that comes with being in a place that is relatively new to me. I've been living in this town for a year now, primarily focused on language learning and relationship building.

When I think about some recent challenges we've had in communication with our local partners and about the task ahead of my team in church planting among the Fulani—one of the largest and most widely dispersed ethnic groups in Africa—it feels pretty daunting! Do I have the needed gifts? Isn't there someone who could do this better!? I recognize my need for the Lord's enabling as well as the need to work together as the Body of Christ.

Some verses the Lord directed me to were 2 Corinthians 12:9–10. His power rests on me as I am weak and come to Him for help. I am thankful that He is strong and that He wants to use weak and imperfect people. And I am also thankful for the joy of working with a team and having teammates who are gifted in areas I am not and vice versa!

Please pray for open hearts among the Fulani and that God will lead my team and me to people whose hearts He is working in.
