## CALL TO PRAYER





### NEXT GENERATION LABORERS

We remember some years ago visiting a church in the U.S. At a missions meeting we attended, everyone's phones began ringing at 10:02 a.m.—and then everyone started to pray. This was their daily reminder to pray Luke 10:2, where Jesus tells His disciples that the harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few—and to therefore pray to the Lord of the harvest.

We have been tremendously encouraged as we have visited various churches over the recent months. We have seen that the Lord is doing a new thing among youth, calling them into His harvest fields. This is our seventh home assignment, and we have never seen such levels of their responsiveness to Christ's call to the nations. We are seeing a deeper desire, particularly on the part of young people, to invest their lives for things of eternal significance.

One eight-year-old girl in a small church in northern Minnesota told us, in all sincerity, that she sensed God's call to be a missionary. A high schooler asked the Lord one night at the church's missions conference if He was calling her to serve Him in missions. She shared with us the next day that she clearly sensed God's call. Many others have responded in a similar fashion and several shared with us how they sensed God's call through Alliance Youth's LIFE Conference and how they are following through.

Young people are sensing God's call to the nations and demonstrating a fresh willingness to follow Him in that call. This has been one of the most encouraging things we have seen in the U.S. over the past 30 years we've served overseas.

Please pray Luke 10:2 over your young people, encouraging them in their journey and releasing them to the Lord and His purposes for their lives as He calls them. The safest place is in the middle of His will.

#### **BAKING FOR THE KINGDOM**

Our church plant is small, but growing, and is located in a hard and broken community. To do our community night week after week, we are thankful that God has brought partners from surrounding churches to join with us. They often have an activity prepared to engage the families and children—recently, it was baking apple crisp.

That night, we had a very full kitchen with people rotating in and out. Even the "cool kids" who thought they wouldn't like baking ended up loving it! One of those same "cool kids" told a volunteer that he feels safe at our church on Mondays. Please pray for us as we navigate integrating visitors more and more into the life of the church. Please also pray as we transition to a new rhythm of community nights—we trust it will provide us and our volunteers with more margin, eliminating burnout and allowing for more intimate connections with people who are seeking and needing spiritual growth.

#### **SMALL STEPS**

As we see funds roll in, we are able to use God's money to bless those around us here, sharing His love.

Watercolor paper, brushes, and paints were bought to help at-risk girls living at a safe house here in town. We get wonderful language practice as we volunteer in leading a watercolor class and swap stories with these precious girls.

We were able to buy a yogurt starter for a local believer who has a small farm and milk business in town. She is now making yogurt regularly and will hopefully sell yogurt soon in her small store! Pray that this small business will create a huge impact for God's Kingdom—her and her husband have a heart to reach their neighbors.

Our faithful house helper for the last few months needed more consistent work. Her husband had a stroke five years ago and hasn't been able to provide for the family. They have six children and live month to month trying to just put food on the table. After building a trusting relationship, we were able to help her relieve some debt and start a small business making Mexican food. There are 11 people living in her tiny house and the extra income helps her buy school supplies for the children. Pray for God's provision and comfort for her and her family.

We were also able to provide a small care package for a homeless woman with her small child. She only wanted a baby bottle, but we were able to give her some clean water, powdered milk, a bottle, and a bit of money to provide some immediate relief for other pressing needs.

We are learning that sustainable longterm solutions for poverty take a lot of time, effort, and discussion. We praise God for available resources to play a small role in bringing His light to these dark places. Please pray that God uses our small efforts to make a big impact.
